### Frequently Asked Questions: U.S. Travel Association Summer Auction

#### 1. Is donating a package considered a political contribution?

No. Donating a travel package to the auction is an **in-kind contribution to the U.S. Travel Association**, a nonprofit trade organization. It is **not a contribution to TravelPAC**, and it is not subject to campaign finance limits.

# 2. Can I donate a package if I'm not a U.S. Travel member?

Yes, but the donation must be made in coordination with a U.S. Travel member, who will be listed as the contributing party. Non-member items may be bundled to enhance a member's package—valuable assets to enhance travel packages.

## 3. What happens if a company or ineligible donor wins a package?

The proceeds from the auction are **allocated after the event**. If the purchaser is ineligible to contribute to TravelPAC, the funds are retained by the U.S. Travel Association in its **general advocacy fund**.

#### 4. How is compliance with FEC regulations ensured?

Our legal counsel and FEC compliance professionals review each transaction **after the auction concludes**. Only eligible purchasers' proceeds go to TravelPAC.

# 5. Will my donation be publicly linked to a PAC?

No. Any recognition for the donation is linked to the Summer Auction event and U.S. Travel Association—not to TravelPAC.

#### 6. Why is this fundraising structure legal?

Because donors contribute to the Association (not the PAC), and only legally eligible proceeds are directed to TravelPAC, the process is in line with FEC rules. The system is carefully structured to ensure compliance with 11 CFR § 114.2, § 100.52, and § 102.5.
