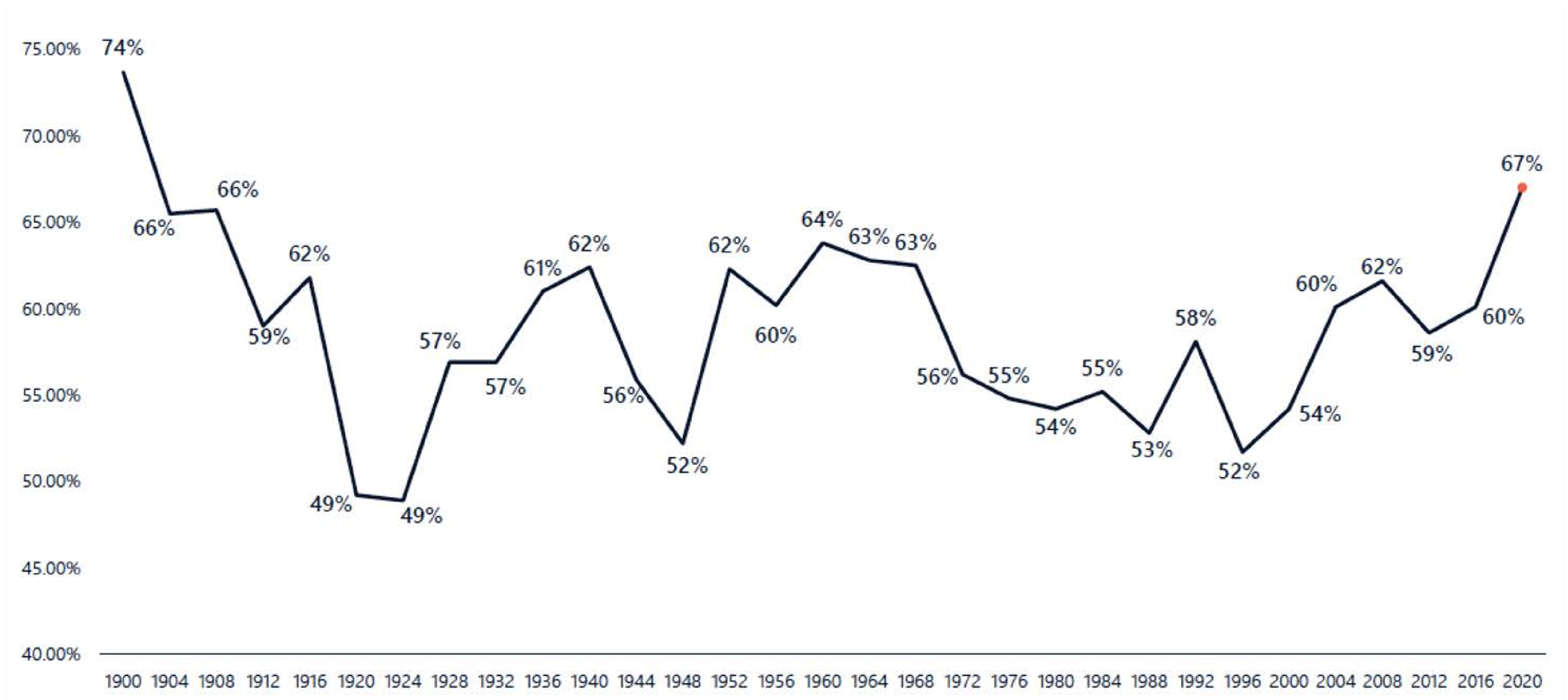

Congressional Redistricting Outlook After the 2020 Elections

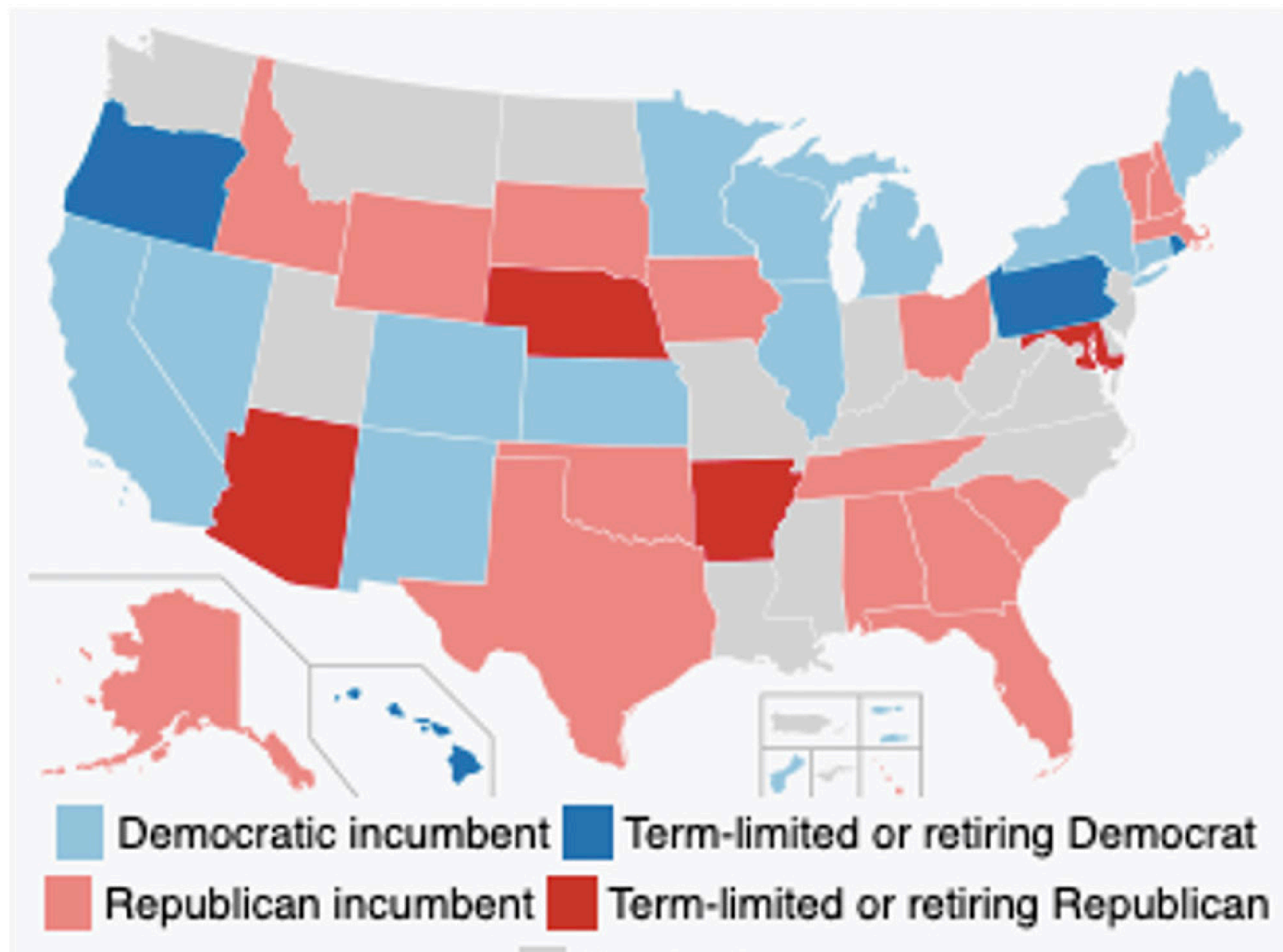
