

WEEKLY CORONAVIRUS IMPACT ON TRAVEL EXPENDITURES IN THE U.S.

MAY 14, 2020 UPDATE

NATIONAL FINDINGS

In the week ending May 9th, travel spending rose modestly for the second consecutive week returning to levels experienced the week ending April 11th.

National weekly travel spending saw a minor gain, ticking up to \$2.9 billion, as the benefits of easing lockdown measures began to take hold.

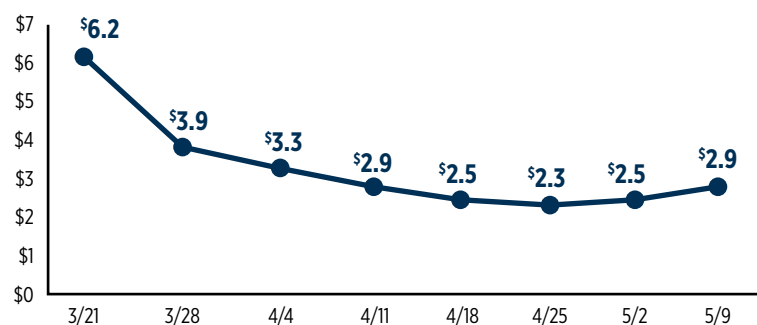
Nevertheless, the travel economy registered 87% below last year's levels for the week ending May 9th.

Despite continuing its upward trajectory, travel spending remains at depressed levels, recording a \$19.0 billion loss for the week ending May 9th when compared to the same week a year ago.

Since the beginning of March, the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in over \$157 billion in losses for the U.S. travel economy.

National Weekly Travel Spending

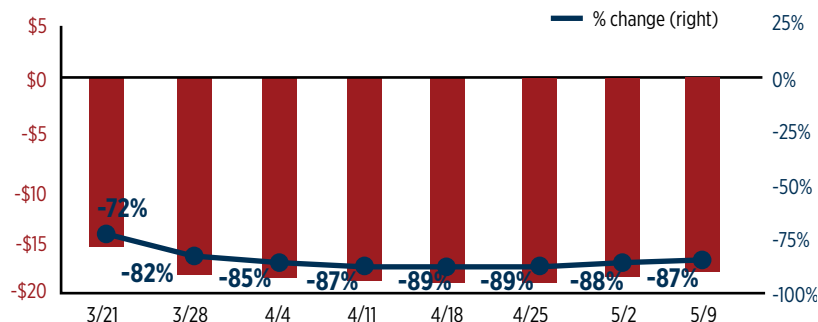

National Weekly Travel Spending

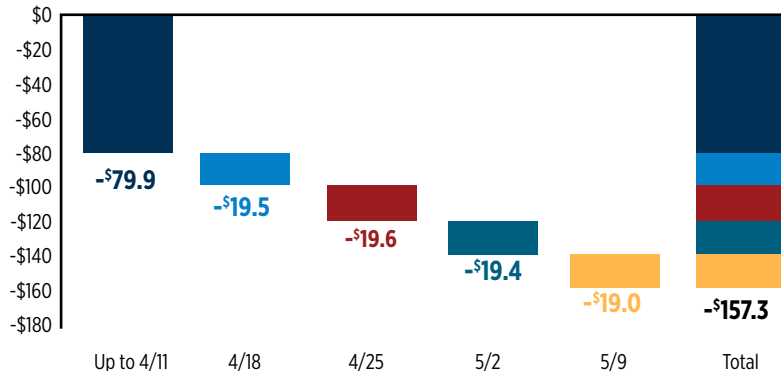
(\$ billions, year-over-year change)

(\$ billions)



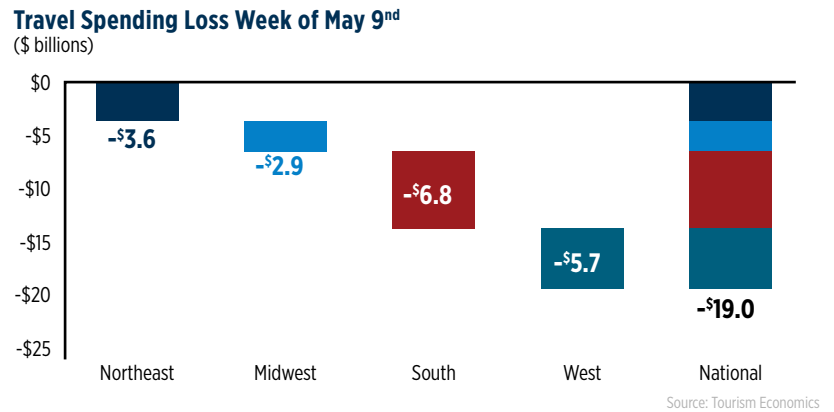
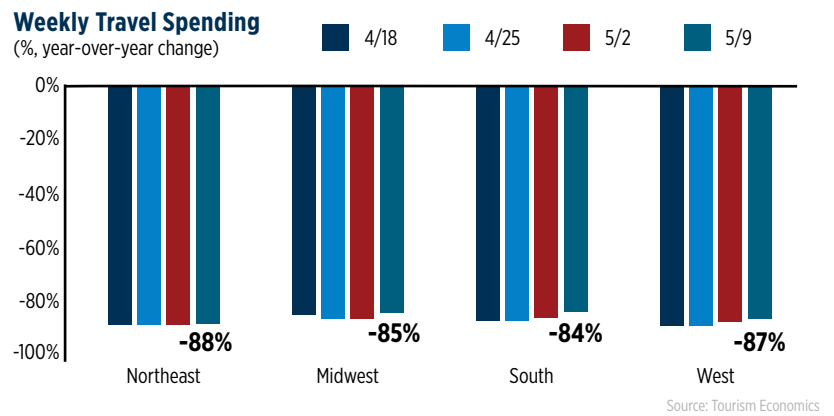
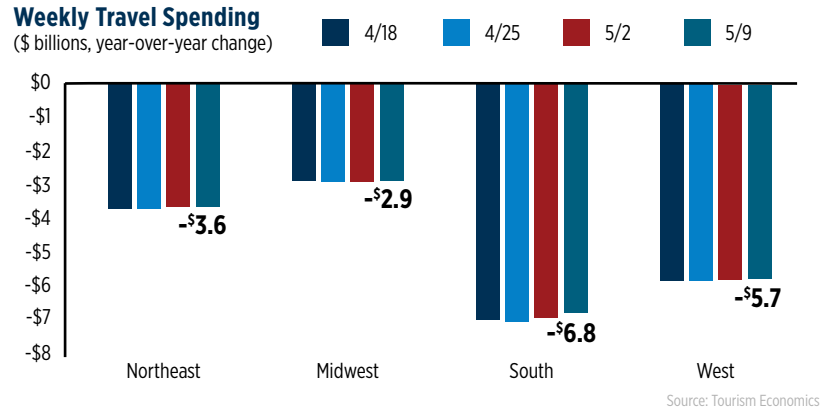

REGIONAL FINDINGS

Travel spending losses for the week ending May 9th fell slightly in the Northeast, South, and West, tallying \$3.6 billion, \$6.8 billion and \$5.7 billion in losses, respectively. While weekly losses in the Midwest abated slightly, losses still totaled approximately \$2.9 billion.

Over the past ten weeks, cumulative losses have tallied \$30.4 billion for the Northeast, \$23.3 billion for the Midwest, \$55.8 billion for the South, and \$47.8 billion for the West.

The Northeast (-88%) and West (-87%) registered one percentage point improvements compared to last week. The Midwest (-85%) and South (-84%) experienced slightly more substantial improvements of two and three percentage points, respectively.



REGIONAL FINDINGS (CONTINUED)

Hawaii and the District of Columbia endured yet another week of declines exceeding 95% in the week ending May 9th; Massachusetts and Illinois suffered losses greater than 90%.

The number of states experiencing weekly losses of less than 80% increased again last week from six to nine states.

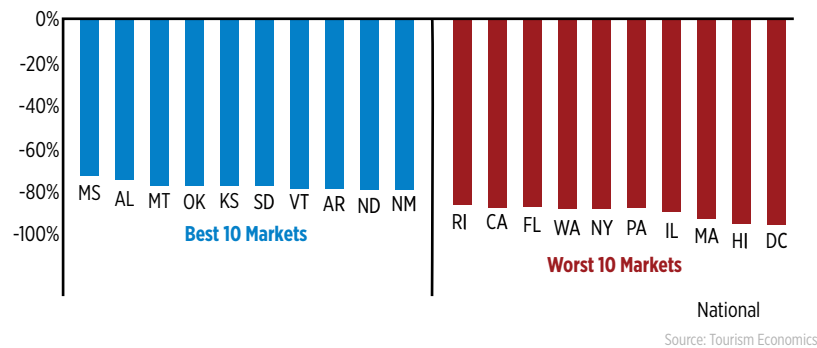
This week saw broad improvement as weekly losses improved in 45 states, with Kentucky, Nebraska, Montana, and Alabama seeing their percentage decline improve by more than 5%.

These persistent drops in travel spending have caused a loss of \$20.3 billion in federal, state, and local tax revenue since March 1st.

This includes \$12.6 billion in federal taxes, \$4.7 billion in state taxes, and \$3.0 billion in local tax revenue.

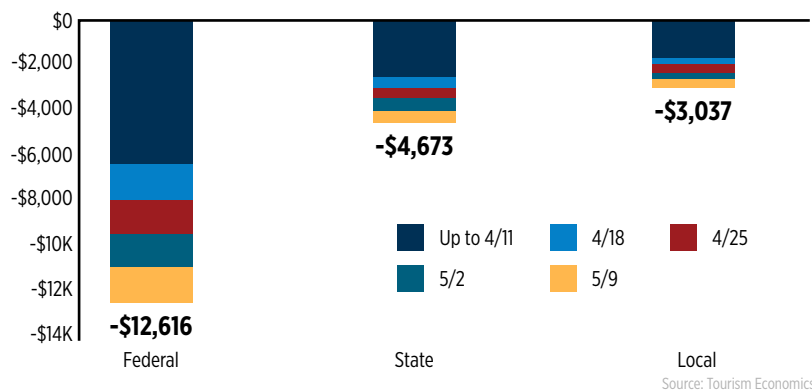
Weekly Travel Spending (Week Ending May 9)
