## THE VISA WAIVER PROGRAM MAKES AMERICA MORE SECURE

EXPANDING THE VISA WAIVER PROGRAM WILL STRENGTHEN SECURITY, GROW OUR ECONOMY, CREATE AMERICAN JOBS AND IMPROVE OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH TRUSTED ALLIES.

## FACT

- Travel is our nation's number one services export, generating a trade surplus of \$59 billion in 2019.
- Overseas travelers stay longer and spend more while here: an average of 18 nights and about \$4,200 per person per trip.
- For every 35 overseas travelers who decide to visit the United States, an additional American job is created.
- In 2018 alone, 23 million travelers arrived through the VWP (57% of overseas visitors), generating \$190 billion in economic output and supporting nearly one million jobs.

## ACTION

Change the name to Secure Travel Partnership to reflect the program's strict security requirements.

Expand the Visa Waiver Program to qualified countries.
